Is anyone interested in applying for Canadian citizenship? As you likely know, there are many requirements to meet before non-citizens can accomplish this goal. One of the requirements is to present acceptable scores in either one of two If the information above seems confusing, there is help available. I am planning to lead an information session here at Equilibrium sometime in December or January. The session will cover basic information about the CELPIP and IELTS tests, as well as the two types of formats each offers. In addition, I will present some information about study techniques and tips for IELTS or CELPIP. Finally, I will take questions relating to which type of test may be best for participants to take, based on the strengths and interests of each person. Anyone who is interested in taking this session should talk to their teacher or tutor, who will in turn inform me about your interest. If there is enough interest, I will be happy to lead a workshop, which would likely be a regular weekday (Monday to Thursday) in the morning for about one hour. I hope to hear from interested people soon!



tests: IELTS (International English Language Testing System) or CELPIP (Canadian English Language Proficiency Index Program). Although CELPIP and IELTS are different types of tests, acceptable scores in either are used by the Government of Canada to determine if an applicant is eligible to become a Canadian citizen. Both tests measure a person's English abilities in four different areas: listening, speaking, reading and writing. However, IELTS and CELPIP are quite different from each other. You need to know which of the CELPIP or IELTS test formats to complete and submit to be considered for Canadian citizenship.



CHOLULA

Cholula- the oldest city in México

Cholula is a city and district located in the center west of the state of Puebla, near Puebla City, in central México. Cholula is considered the oldest city in America, inhabited without interruption since its origins. Cholula is best known for its Great Pyramid, with the Iglesia de Nuestra Señora de los Remedios sanctuary on top, as well as its numerous churches.

The most important tourist attraction of the city is the Great Pyramid with the Nuestra Señora de los Remedios sanctuary on top. At first glance, the pyramid looks like a hill as most of it is overgrown. The south side of the pyramid has been excavated and there is a network of tunnels inside. The pyramid and church receive about 220,000 visitors each year, and on certain special occasions such as the spring equinox and the feast of the Virgin of the Remedies, there can be up to 20,000 visitors at a time.

From the top of the pyramid, in the sanctuary atrium, it is possible to see the Malinche, Popocatepetl, Iztaccíhuatl and Pico de Orizaba Volcanoes in the far eastern horizon. According to myth, the pyramid was built by a giant named Xelhua of adobe bricks, after he escaped a flood in the neighboring Valley of Mexico. The pyramid is small part of the archeological zone of Cholula, which is estimated at 154 hectares. Building of the pyramid began in the pre-Classic period and over time was built over six times to its final dimensions of 120 metres (390 ft) on each side at the base and eighteen meters tall. This base is four times the size of that of the Great Pyramid of Giza and is the largest pyramid base in the Americas. Two of the stages of construction use talud-tablero architecture which was also used in Teotihuacan.

Some of the pyramid constructions have had burials, with skeletons found in various positions, with many offerings, especially ceramics. The last state of construction has stairs on the west side leading to a temple on top, which faced Iztaccíhuatl The Great Pyramid of Cholula, also known as Tlachihualtepetl (Nahuatl for "made-by-hand mountain"), is a huge complex located in Cholula, Puebla, Mexico. It is the largest archaeological site of a pyramid (temple) in the New World, as well as the largest pyramid known to exist in the world today. The pyramid stands 55 metres (180 ft) above the surrounding plain, and in its final form it measured 450 by 450 metres (1,480 by 1,480 ft). The pyramid is a temple that traditionally has been viewed as having been dedicated to the god Quetzalcoatl.

My father's Story

My father, Dougal, would have been 105 years old this December. During World War II, he was in the Canadian Army. He was an artilleryman, but he also worked on communications. The following is an excerpt from his memoir in a local history book. It gives a small idea of what life was like for soldiers during the war. I was a signaller, that meant that I was in charge of both wired and radio communications. One night, we were out laying lines, so we could join the observation post to the guns. There were many tanks moving around and they cut the lines, so we had to go out to fix them. We were in no-man's land, which was the area between our troops and the enemy. We joined two lines and heard Germans shouting, "Achtung! Achtung!" which means attention. It didn't take us very long to cut that line and try to find our own, which was incredibly difficult to do in pitch dark because we couldn't use a light.

I remember another time that we thought we were going to have a rest and sleep for a change, when along came a flight of bombers. The bombs started falling close by while I was sitting up cleaning my rifle. Then one of the boys said, "You'd better get down this hole, Grassy!" So I jumped down the hole and a bomb landed right where I'd been sitting. When I went back up to get my rifle, it was blown to pieces. They called my brother, Norman, and I Grassy because we were the only ones from Saskatchewan and all the Alberta boys thought the only things that came from Saskatchewan were grasshoppers. I guess one of the biggest battles we fought was the Falaise Gap. That was when the Germans were surrounded and were trying to break out. There were so many dead it was almost impossible to walk without stepping on them. Of course, in those days, it didn't bother us too much. I guess we thought it was their fault, but they were fighting for their country, just like we were. In December 1946, we Norman and I boarded the Queen Elizabeth passenger ship and headed back to Canada. I was a much better ship than we had gone over on. The only trouble was that a lot of the boys were missing, never to return to Canada. By Darren P.

Povitica or Potica is a traditional, very popular Croatian sweet pastry

FOR THE DOUGH:

A pan 10 x 4 x 3 inches (25 x 11 x 7 cm)

\circ 285 g flour

- \circ 120 g whole milk
- 15 g water
- 1,4 g dry yeast
- 50 g sugar
- 1 large egg (60 g)
- 22 g unsalted butter melted and cooled
- \circ 5 g salt

FOR THE FILLING:

- o 280 g walnuts
- o 58 g unsalted butter
- \circ 60 g whole milk
- o 95 g sugar
- 1/2 Tbsp unsweetened cocoa powder
- \circ 3 g cinnamon powder
- \circ 1 large egg yolk
- \circ 1/4 tsp vanilla extract
- pinch of salt
 - FOR BRUSH:
- 25 g unsalted butter melted and cooled
- icing sugar (optional)





Instructions:

- Make the povitica dough.
- In a bowl add the flour together with milk,water,egg and dry yeast.
- Mix the ingredians until a homogenous dough is obtained.
- Add the sugar and knead until it is fully integrated.
- Transfer to a work surface and start kneading. You will have to obtain a smooth, silky and developed dough.
- Once you have a medium-developed gluten, add the butter. The ideal is to do it little by little, waiting for the dough to absorb it.
- Knead for about 12-15 minutes to develop the gluten well and obtain an elastic, soft and very well developed dough.
- Make a ball with our dough, grease a bowl lightly with oil and introduce the dough inside.
- Cover with film and let rise until it doubles its volume. Approximately 2- 3 hours.
- Make the filling while the dough is rising.
- In a food processor add walnuts together with sugar, cinnamon, salt and cocoa powder. Blend and set aside.
- Transfer the walnut mixture to a bowl and pour in the milk.
- Add the vanilla together with the yolk and mix until completely homogenized.
- Let it stand at room temperature, covering the bowl with film or a plate, until needed.
- Stretch the dough to shape the povitica.
- Stretch the dough on a sheet.
- Sprinkle the working surface very lightly with corn flour.
- Dump the dough and degass it gently.
- Roll the dough out with a roller to shape a 25,5 x 18 inches (65 x 45 cm) rectangle. As we stretch the dough, we will use our hands to stretch and shape it.

- With the aid of a spatula we place small piles on the entire surface of the dough and proceed to spread it.
- The filling is somewhat dense, you will most likely have to help your hands to distribute it evenly or beat an egg white and add it to the filling.
- Cover to the edges except for the one that will seal the dough when rolled up. The longest side, the farthest from us.
- \circ Roll up the dough.
- Roll the dough making sure that there is no gap between each layer. To do this we will roll carefully and with the help of both hands.
- Once it's rolled up, we'll make sure the joint is sealed.
- Shape a -S with the dough roll and place it into the pan.
- Cover with film and let the dough rise until we notice that the dough has grown in size.
- Bake povitica.
- \circ Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- Brush the povitica with half of the butter and introduce at medium height.
- Bake for 15 minutes, reduce heat to 300°F and leave for 45 minutes more. The total baking time is 60 minutes.
- Remove from the oven and brush with the remaining butter.
- Let it rest in the pan for 20 minutes. Unmould and let cool completely on a rack.

Shortbread Cookies

1 cup soft butter 1 and 1/2 cup flour 1/2 cup icing sugar optional 1/2 cup red or green gaze cherries

Method

Preheat oven to 325

Combine butter, icing sugar and flour and mix at a high speed with an electric mixer for 10 minutes until light and fluffy (this step is very important). Drop by a teaspoon onto an ungreased cookie sheet. (Optional - decorate the cookies with half a cherry). Bake at 325 for 15-20 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove to a rack to cool. Makes about 36 cookies.


blown my brains out," which drew a few giggles from the crowd.

Buying locally produced and manufactured Canadian goods have always been a good thing. Which companies are Canadian? Here are some companies that you may not have known were Canadian.



ARITZIA Inc. is a Canadian clothing fashion retailer, founded in 1984 by Brian Hill from Vancouver, BC. His idea was to sell magnificent clothes in stunning spaces with captivating service and reasonable prices. Multiple manufacturers provide services to the company and monitoring they

meet their standards.

Aritzia went public on October 3, 2016. Its reported net income for the fourth quarter of 2016 was \$18.72 million. Aritzia operates 84 stores in North America. 63 boutiques are in Canada and 21 stores in the USA.

Who wears LULULEMON yoga pants? Lululemon Athletica is a yoga pant company founded by Chip Wilson in 1998 in Vancouver, B.C. He sold the first pair of pants in 2005 and by July 2007 the company raised \$327.6 million CAD. After selling 18.2 million shares the total of assets in 2018 was \$2.08 billion. The number of employees working there is now 15,700. The company still makes \$483.80 million profit per year.

In February 2014 Lululemon opened the first store in Europe in Covent Garden, London, U.K. The company's goal is to train their staff so well that they can positively influence their families and communities, as well as the customers coming into the stores and tell them features of the yoga pants.

IMAX sells high resolution cameras, film, format, film projectors, and steep stadium seating. The co-founders of the company are, Graeme Ferguson, Roman Kraiter, Robert Kerr, and William C. Shaw. They started the company late 1960s and early 1970s in Canada. IMAX is a Canadian Corporation that is based in Mississauga, Ontario. The number of employees currently is 526. The net income for 2012 was \$41.3 million US. IMAX projection systems have been installed in 129 theatres worldwide as of December 1995. At the heart of the IMAX vision lie three qualities: a commitment to the customers and shareholders, a commitment to excellence delivering the best entertainment experiences through new technologies. It is a private company. IMAX is listed on the TSX, but you cannot buy shares in Canada you can only buy shares in the USA. What sets an IMAX screen apart from other theatre screen is that it is 4500 times bigger than an average television screen. 

MOUNTAIN EQUIMENT CO-OP (MEC) sells outdoor recreational gear and






